The funding of cooling zones, for example, is indicative of solving for a symptom rather than treating the underlying condition of our planet. Our generation demands bold action – such as investments in alternative energy, divestment from fossil fuels, and a true commitment to advancing the Blue Economy. We need all global leaders to declare national climate emergencies worldwide, and to provide dedicated funding, resources, and attention at this critical moment in history. More than 250,000 people are projected to die every year as a direct result of climate change. There is no time for delay. Our environment – and specifically our ocean – cannot afford for elected officials to continue acting at a glacial pace, while the ice caps melt, wildlife dies, temperatures become untenable and environmental disasters threaten our communities. I call on others in the private and social sectors to join the global youth activists mobilized by the Sustainable Ocean Alliance who are collectively fighting to mitigate climate change and restore the health of our ocean. Now more than ever, urgent and concerted efforts to combat the climate crisis are essential.
