GLOBAL YOUTH LEADERS TO CONVENE IN PANAMA AT OUR OCEAN YOUTH LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

The Summit, cohosted by Sustainable Ocean Alliance and Our Ocean organizers, will tackle the biggest threats facing our ocean

PANAMA CITY, Panama - (January 30, 2023) More than 70 young ocean leaders from 45 countries will come together to tackle the biggest threats facing our ocean at the 6th <u>Our Ocean Youth Leadership Summit</u> in Panama next month. <u>Sustainable Ocean Alliance</u> (SOA) will cohost this event once again, in cooperation with Our Ocean organizers.

The youth summit was created by U.S. Special Presidential Envoy for Climate John Kerry and SOA in 2016. This year's event will take place February 27th-March 1st at the vibrant Bio Museo in Panama City. The youth participants (ages 18-35) will devise solutions around 6 impact areas:

- 1. Climate change
- 2. Marine pollution
- 3. Maritime security
- 4. Marine protected areas (MPAs)
- 5. Sustainable blue economy
- 6. Sustainable fisheries

The summit is an integral part of the Our Ocean Conference, during which governments, businesses, and advocates will convene to discuss solutions to restore and save the ocean through measurable impacts and cooperation. Following the Our Ocean Youth Leadership Summit, the main Our Ocean Conference will be held March 2nd-3rd. For more information, visit the event website, or follow #OurOceanYLS on social media. This is the 6th year that SOA has cohosted the youth summit, alongside the U.S. Department of State, European Union, Indonesian Ministry of Marine Affairs, and the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Since then, they have ensured more than 600 youth from 60+ countries have been able to participate and have a voice in the fight against climate change. All programming will be delivered in English, with simultaneous translation in Spanish. The goals of the Summit are to:

- Engage young leaders as a key driver for change
- Develop technological solutions that can address the greatest threats facing our planet
- Foster intergenerational cooperation
