In a groundbreaking <u>Impact Report</u> released today, SOA shares that it has accelerated 222 solutions, supporting innovative startups and nonprofits in order to heal, restore, and sustain our ocean.

SOA is the world's largest network of young ocean leaders and home to the first Ocean Solutions Accelerator program. In 2019, Benioff challenged the nonprofit to accelerate 100 ocean solutions on stage at the World Economic Forum. As detailed by the newly-released report, the 222 solutions accelerated by SOA have already had the following impact:

- 15,540 metric tons of CO2 reduced, avoided, or sequestered
- 1,755 metric tons of solid waste removed, upcycled, or avoided
- 89,128 square meters of blue carbon ecosystems protected or restored
- 150,000 kilometers of coastline monitored for climate change adaptation planning
- 67,000 whales saved from marine collisions; and the production of more than 150 ocean literacy reports and media projects
- 596 blue jobs created within SOA's solutions

The Impact Report details SOA's extensive reach and how it dispersed \$1.3 million in funding to 45 startups and 177 nonprofit microgrants. Organizations highlighted in the report include:

- **AKUA**: A plant-based food company focused on feeding people sustainably while reversing climate change and restoring health to our world's oceans.
- Full Cycle Bioplastics: A startup that uses its patented technology to convert organic waste into compostable, biodegradable bioplastic.
- <u>Tēnaka</u>: A social business focused on restoring our oceans by developing specific corporate responsibility programs and impact measurement technologies for businesses.
- <u>Mikoko Pamoja</u>: A community-led project dedicated to protecting and restoring mangroves through the sale of carbon credits and has resulted in the planting of 4,000 new mangrove seedlings every year.
- <u>rePurpose Global</u>: The world's leading Plastic Action Platform dedicated to reducing waste, reviving lives, and restoring nature's balance through advisory, action, and advocacy.
